Describe Your Artwork

- What is the title of your creation?
- How would you describe your image or design?
- What image or images does your artwork contain?
- Incorporate the elements or principles that you have incorporated in your work.

How was your artwork created?

- What materials or media have you used?
- Explain the different processes you used in your work's creation.
- Incorporate the tools that you have used in the process.

What Inspired Your Design or Artwork?

- Who inspired you?
- What inspired you?
- What or how inspired you from these sources?
- Does your artwork evoke any particular emotion or emotions for you?
- Are you making a social or personal statement with this work?
- What feelings would you like your piece to evoke in the viewer.

Why did you create this design or artwork?

- What would you like to accomplish as an artist?
- Did this creation help you accomplish that?
- Explain how this was accomplished with your artwork.
- Explain if you feel this piece did not meet your artistic goal.
- Why do you create art?
- How does your artwork fit with current trends of contemporary art?

Final Thoughts

- Explain the how this process helped you grow as an artist.
- How did this piece morph from your original design if at all?
- What caused the changes?
- What have you learned from this piece and will incorporate for future artwork or designs?
- Use words that the average reader can understand.
- Your statement will be viewed by the public. Check your spelling, grammar and punctuation.
- Be sure to use simple fonts that can be easily read.
- Write in the first person. Do not refer to yourself as “the artist” or in the third person.
- Use a 10-12 point font.
- Your statement should be limited to one page and single spaced.
